Franklin Square celebrates the magic of the holiday season Nov. 9-Dec. 31 with the return of *The Franklin Square Holiday Festival* featuring *Electrical Spectacle* presented by PECO. More than 50,000 lights shimmer, dance, and illuminate the Square to a soundtrack of holiday classics, during two shows alternating every 30 minutes, 4:30-8 p.m.

Between shows, warm up around the fire pits or inside **Ben's Sweets & Treats**, which offers comfort foods and warm beverages. Kids of all ages will love the fresh donuts, cookie decorating and other holiday favorites and for grown-ups, the **Winter Beer Garden** serves local beers nightly. SERVICES

Language Services Park maps are available in Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Polish, Russian and Spanish. The Visitor Center concierge staff is fluent in nine languages including Spanish, French, German and Italian.
