### NEED EVEN MORE REASONS TO EXPLORE PHILADELPHIA'S HISTORIC DISTRICT?

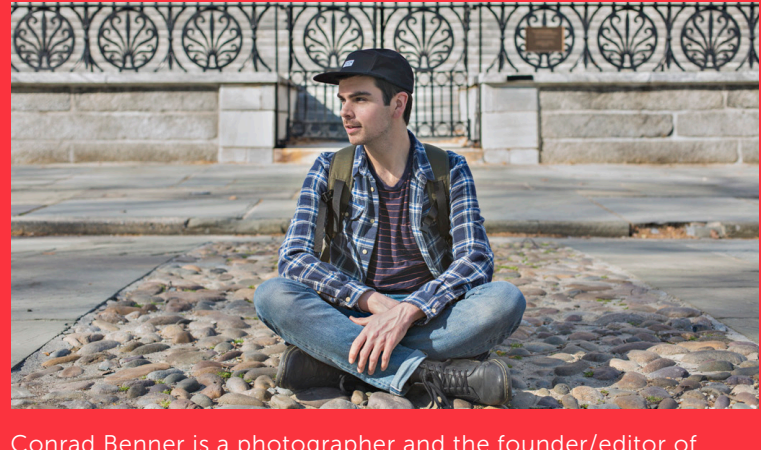
